Resident featured at EnterTrainment Junction mini-model show

For nearly half a century, Isaac Zelazny has been building models – mostly out of cardstock and paper.

It's what the General Electric mechanical engineer does to relax. He even brings his materials with him when he travels overseas for work.

Many of the models Zelazny constructs are aircraft, mostly military, because, he says, there are so many to choose from.

This weekend the community will get an opportunity to watch him at work and examine his handiwork.

Zelazny's models will be on display as part of the free Mini Model Engineering Show, March 7-8 at EnterTrainment Junction, 7379 Squire Court in West Chester Township.

At the show, he and his wife Cindy, will talk to visitors about his hobby and how it's done. Zelazny plans to showcase 10-15 of the 50-plus models he's built.

"The fascination for me is the great variety you have with military aircraft," the Liberty Township resident said.

"(For) me my hobby and work – there is a blurry line. I love what I do. It's a passion I have. I work in an industry I love."

boy – about third grade – and put together his first plastic model. Soon after he saw booklets of paper models imported from Germany and added those to his repertoire.

Nowadays, he works mostly in paper or card stock using kits or patterns downloaded from the internet and printed at home.

On average he spends about a month assembling each model – usually on a 1/33 scale – which can have

anywhere from 300-600 pieces that must be cut out and glued together.

Oftentimes, he touches up the edges to insure color consistency. When completed, models can be anywhere from 10-inches to three feet long.

A member of the Cincinnati Scale Modelers, Zelazny has designed his own models but now prefers using kits. He blogs at www.papermodelers.com, and often beta tests new models.
